no color that will not go with this fabric as it is made up of so many beautiful colors.

The challenge is to take 1 or 2 pieces of fabric, which is cut in 2.5 and 4.5 strips WOF. You must use a full strip of fabric in the quilt. It can be cut into any shape or form that you want just so you use the whole strip. There is no changing of the color. The quilt must be at least 36 in sq. or bigger. It must be finished including the binding. You have till June to finish. I cannot wait to see what is matched with the fabric as we have some of the best quilters in the state of North Carolina.

The meeting was great. All the quilts that were there to be bound were worked on and labels were attached. This is a great way to help the people delivering the comfort quilts and a way to sit and sew and interact with new people. I have been a part of this guild for many years and the generosity of all of you is outstanding. Thank you to all of you who helped.


Hello Members!

Holiday Blocks



BLOCK PARTY 2019-2020

Things of the Home

BRICK AND MORTAR

From 5 assorted blue and grey scrap fabrics,

From white

Cut 10 4.5" x 2.5" rectangles

Cut 3 1/5" x 13" strips

4 2.5" x 2/5" squares

Row 1: sew 3 rectangles together

Row 2: sew 2 rectangles together, add a square at both ends

Row 3: repeat Row 1

Row 4: Repeat Row 2

Between Row 1 and 2 add white strip

Between Row 2 and 3 add white strip

Between Row 3 and 4 add white strip

Iron all seams in one direction, DO NOT TRIM

Should result in 12.5" x 12.5" square block


