December 2019 Block Party

Pine Tree Quilt Block

The Pine Tree block uses four different green scraps for the tree limbs, white fabric for the background, and a brown or dark green scrap for the tree trunk.

This block will finish at 10"x10" square.

Cutting: From the white 2.5" strip, cut two 2.5" x 4.5" pieces, two 2.5" x 3.5" pieces, two 2.5" x 1.5" pieces, and eight 2.5" squares.

You will need four green pieces in the following sizes: 2.5" x 10.5", 2.5" x 7.5", 2.5" x 5.5", 2.5" x 3.5".

From your brown/darkest green, cut a 2.5" square piece.

Sewing:

Sew a 2.5" square white piece on the diagonal to each narrow end of your green pieces. Iron and trim the extra away.

Assemble each row according to this diagram, and then sew the rows together for your tree:

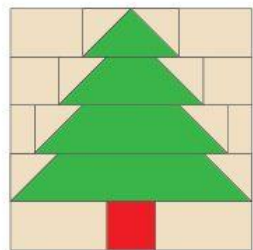
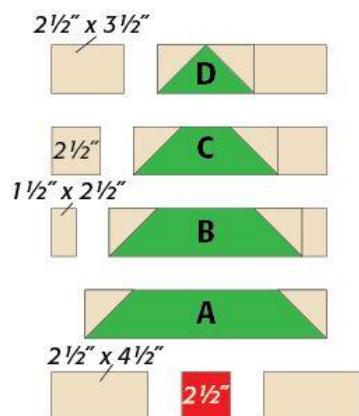

It can be cut into any shape or form that you want just so you use the whole strip. There is no changing of the color. The quilt must be at least 36 in sq. or bigger. It must be finished including the binding. You have until the June meeting to finish. Happy Quilting!

Volunteer Sign-Ups

Volunteer Sign-Ups have begun and will continue at every Guild Meeting until the show in March. Attached to this article is the list of volunteer descriptions. Please review the descriptions so that you know what will be required of you. If you volunteer you will receive one free ticket to enter the show.

Quilt Registration Opens Dec 2

Show Quilt Registration

Show quilt registrations open December 2nd. This is an online registration and we are looking for 100% online registrations. To accommodate those who may not have internet access or wish help with registering we will have a laptop at the December and January Guild Meetings for you to register online at the meeting. The registration form is listed below (page 16) for your information and can also be found on the website. Review it before you go online to register your quilt so that you have all of the information you need ready to go.

Guild Challenge - Hearts in Flight

Guild Challenge quilt registration also opens December 2nd. This is paper registration only and submission instructions are on the registration form. The form is posted below (page 15) for your convenience and you can also view and download the form from the website.

Silent Auction - SPCA Wake County

Create a small quilt of any animal theme to be auctioned off during the Quilt Show. All proceeds will be given to the charity that was selected by the Guild Membership. Guild and non-guild members may submit as many quilts as they like for the silent auction.

2020 Quilt Show Volunteer Descriptions

All volunteer slots are 2 hour shifts unless otherwise specified in the description.

Shifts are 9:00 to 11:00; 11:00 am to 1:00 pm; 1:00 to 3:00 and 3:00 to 5:00.

All volunteers are requested to arrive 15 minutes prior to their shift.

All volunteers will receive a maximum of one free ticket to the show.

Entry tickets can be used before or after their volunteer slot.

Below are listed most of the volunteer descriptions for the tasks needed for the quilt show. Please read through them and see which ones might match your interest in preparation for sign up night at the February and March Guild Meetings.

Quilt Review Day – Saturday, March 14 – 10:00 am – 2:00 pm

Kirk of Kildaire Pres Church, 200 High Meadow Dr, Cary

A total of 12 volunteers are needed for this.

Each quilt must be reviewed and compared to the quilt submission form (includes measuring quilts, verifying the quilt is in the correct category, check for pet hairs, odors, etc.)

Quilt Judging Day – Wednesday, March 18 – 8:30 am to 5:00 pm

A total of 15 volunteers are needed for this.

Scribe (4 volunteers) -- A scribe writes down the judge's comments on the judging form. This is a sit-down job that requires legible handwriting. Scribes are paired and alternate writing to give each other a writing break, but must be able to pay attention to the judge for each quilt to help the writing scribe

Fanner (4 volunteers) -- Fanners will assist at the judging table by flipping the stack of quilts for the judge to see, lifting each quilt by the corners for the judge, straightening the quilt as needed while it is on the table, and handing quilts to the runner when the judge is finished. Should be tall, strong, and able to be on their feet for most of the day.

Runners (2 volunteers) -- Runners- Accept quilts from the fanners and carries them to hold table or release table. Must be able to carry quilts. Mix of stand and sit.

Stackers (2 volunteers) - Prepares the judging table by stacking quilts in numerical order and by category. Must be able to carry quilts. Mix of stand and sit.

Recording Secretary (2 volunteers) - Sit down job. Records the numbers of ribbon winning quilts. Accepts judging forms after each category is judged and files them in a file box.

Quilt Set Up and Hanging – Wednesday, March 18; 12:00 – 5:00

A total of 4 volunteer slots are required for this.

Setting up and hanging quilts on the poles

Quilt Set Up and Hanging – Thursday, March 19; 9:00 – 12:00

A total of 8 volunteer slots are required for this.

Setting up and hanging quilts on the poles

2020 Quilt Show Volunteer Descriptions page 2

Quilt Take Down – Saturday, March 21; 4:45 – 7:00

A total of 18 volunteer slots are required for this.

Taking down quilts at the end of the show; checking them out at pick-up time.

Ticket Sales, Friday and Saturday

A total of 16 volunteer slots are required for this.

Will be taking money, making change, and be the first smiling face the public will see when coming to the show. Will also exchange Volunteer vouchers for tickets to the show. Sit down job, 2 people working together.

Ticket Takers; Friday and Saturday

A total of 24 volunteer slots are required for this.

Will be greeting people at the door, taking tickets, handing out show brochures, and answering questions about the show and the layout of the show, including where the restrooms are, all with a smile. Mostly standing, with chairs available, 3 people working together.

Vendor Set Up and Support, Thursday, March 19; 8:00 to 12:00

A total of 2 volunteer slots are required for this.

Assist booth vendors. Coordinate with Lanakila/Ann with signing in vendors, taking vendors to their booth space and answering any vendor questions.

Silent Auction; Friday and Saturday

A total of 8 volunteer slots are required for this.

Silent Auction - one person to man the area during the show hours on Friday and Saturday.

Guild Quilt Raffle Sales; Friday and Saturday

A total of 16 volunteer slots are required for this.

Sitting at a table in the entry way to sell raffle tickets for our quilt raffle.

Sit and Sew; Friday and Saturday

A total of 20 volunteers are required for this.

Sit and Sew - we will need three people in the booth during show hours all three days to help the participants sew their blocks.

Boutique; Friday and Saturday

A total of 16 volunteers are required for this.

Manning the booth to assist customers in purchasing boutique items. There are 2 people required for each shift.

All entry forms will be accepted beginning 12/2/19 until 2/20/20. Quilts may be turned in beginning 1/16/20 at the guild meetings or at a committee member's house no later than 3/1/20.  - Example: a quilt measuring 20” x 25” is okay (90” perimeter)
 - Example: a quilt measuring 20” x 30” is too big (100” perimeter)
