

December's Pine Tree blocks went to Karen Kirschner and Karen Zeher, so it was "Lucky Karen" night!

Make yourself a hot "cuppa" of coffee or tea and complete January's Coffee Cup block in time for the February meeting.

Coming in February: the *House* block, in keeping with our "Things of the Home" theme for 2019-20.

Also, bring in tree blocks of any type, a generous 12.5" square, untrimmed, to send to Australia for the Wollongong Modern Quilt Guild in New South Wales. They will put the blocks together into quilts for Australians affected by the wildfires. They chose the tree block because trees are a symbol of growth and nourishment. For more information and some tree patterns see the Wollongong Modern Quilt Guild post at https://wmqg.tumblr.com/post/190118420413/australia-is-burning

From the Wollongong FAQ sheet:

BLOCK CONSTRUCTION:

- Fabric #bushfireblocks are to be made with 100% cotton quilting fabric
- Thread personal choice

- Batting - none. No quilt as you go blocks please, we'd prefer fabric only blocks to be made into quilts

- Block Size - Finished blocks are to be a generous 12.5 " (inch) square (0.25-0.5" larger is fine). PLEASE DO NOT trim your blocks to less than 12.5". We strongly emphasise the requirement for blocks to be a generous 12.5". This will allow us to trim and square the blocks before piecing Quilt tops together.

- Background - plain white, grey or low volume. Low volume fabrics are light coloured fabrics that may

have small subtle prints, this serves to emphasis the trees which are the focus of the quilt.

- Block Content - The focus of the #bushfireblocks is to be a tree.

o Can we incorporate animals into our tree blocks? YES

o Can we make animal blocks instead of tree blocks? NO

o Can we include wording? YES

- o Can we make embroidered blocks? YES
- o Can we incorporate a symbol of where the block has come from? YES
- o Can we use colours other than green for our trees? YES, please do, the more colour the better!
- o Be creative, be inspired, be brave and have fun making your tree blocks.


The library has acquired four new books this

2020 Quilt Show Volunteer Descriptions

All volunteer slots are 2 hour shifts unless otherwise specified in the description.

Shifts are 9:00 to 11:00; 11:00 am to 1:00 pm; 1:00 to 3:00 and 3:00 to 5:00. All volunteers are requested to arrive 15 minutes prior to their shift. All volunteers will receive a maximum of one free ticket to the show. Entry tickets can be used before or after their volunteer slot.

Below are listed most of the volunteer descriptions for the tasks needed for the quilt show. Please read through them and see which ones might match your interest in preparation for sign up night at the February and March Guild Meetings.

<u>Quilt Review Day – Saturday, March 14 – 10:00 am – 2:00 pm</u> <u>Kirk of Kildaire Pres Church, 200 High Meadow Dr, Cary</u>

A total of 12 volunteers are needed for this.

Each quilt must be reviewed and compared to the quilt submission form (includes measuring quilts, verifying the quilt is in the correct category, check for pet hairs, odors, etc.)

Quilt Judging Day – Wednesday, March 18 – 8:30 am to 5:00 pm

A total of 15 volunteers are needed for this.

<u>Scribe</u> (4 volunteers) -- A scribe writes down the judge's comments on the judging form. This is a sit-down job that requires legible handwriting. Scribes are paired and alternate writing to give each other a writing break, but must be able to pay attention to the judge for each quilt to help the writing scribe

<u>Fanner</u> (4 volunteers) -- Fanners will assist at the judging table by flipping the stack of quilts for the judge to see, lifting each quilt by the corners for the judge, straightening the quilt as needed while it is on the table, and handing quilts to the runner when the judge is finished. Should be tall, strong, and able to be on their feet for most of the day.

<u>Runners</u> (2 volunteers) -- Runners- Accept quilts from the fanners and carries them to hold table or release table. Must be able to carry quilts. Mix of stand and sit.

<u>Stackers</u> (2 volunteers) - Prepares the judging table by stacking quilts in numerical order and by category. Must be able to carry quilts. Mix of stand and sit.

<u>Recording Secretary</u> (2 volunteers) - Sit down job. Records the numbers of ribbon winning quilts. Accepts judging forms after each category is judged and files them in a file box.

Quilt Set Up and Hanging – Wednesday, March 18; 12:00 – 5:00

A total of 4 volunteer slots are required for this. Setting up and hanging quilts on the poles

Quilt Set Up and Hanging – Thursday, March 19; 9:00 – 12:00

A total of 8 volunteer slots are required for this. Setting up and hanging quilts on the poles

Quilt Take Down – Saturday, March 21; 4:45 – 7:00

A total of 18 volunteer slots are required for this. Taking down quilts at the end of the show; checking them out at pick-up time.

Ticket Sales, Friday and Saturday

A total of 16 volunteer slots are required for this.

Will be taking money, making change, and be the first smiling face the public will see when coming to the show. Will also exchange Volunteer vouchers for tickets to the show. Sit down job, 2 people working to-gether.

Ticket Takers; Friday and Saturday

A total of 24 volunteer slots are required for this.

Will be greeting people at the door, taking tickets, handing out show brochures, and answering questions about the show and the layout of the show, including where the restrooms are, all with a smile. Mostly standing, with chairs available, 3 people working together.

Vendor Set Up and Support, Thursday, March 19; 8:00 to 12:00

A total of 2 volunteer slots are required for this.

Assist booth vendors. Coordinate with Lanakila/Ann with signing in vendors, taking vendors to their booth space and answering any vendor questions.

Silent Auction; Friday and Saturday

A total of 8 volunteer slots are required for this. Silent Auction - one person to man the area during the show hours on Friday and Saturday.

Guild Quilt Raffle Sales; Friday and Saturday

A total of 16 volunteer slots are required for this. Sitting at a table in the entry way to sell raffle tickets for our quilt raffle.

Sit and Sew; Friday and Saturday

A total of 20 volunteers are required for this.

Sit and Sew - we will need three people in the booth during show hours all three days to help the participants sew their blocks.

Boutique; Friday and Saturday

A total of 16 volunteers are required for this.

Manning the booth to assist customers in purchasing boutique items. There are 2 people required for each shift.

- Quilts must be 24" square or smaller, or if the quilt is not square then the perimeter must be less than 97".
 - Example: a quilt measuring 20" x 25" is okay (90" perimeter)
 - Example: a quilt measuring 20" x 30" is too big (100" perimeter)
