
Block Party

April 2021 Block of the Month – Expanded Churn Dash/Reflections

Raid your stash for two fabrics in the same colorway, one light and one darker. These directions will make four blocks, two light and two dark.

From each print, cut:

- $4-5\frac{3}{4}$ " squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 8 large triangles total
- 10 − 3" squares
- 8 − 2 ¼ x 3" rectangles
- 8 25/8" squares, cutting each in half diagonally for 16 small triangles total
- 1. Sew together a light print small triangle and a dark print small triangle to make a triangle-square. Press seam toward dark print triangle. The triangle-square should be 2 ¼" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make 16 triangle-squares total.
- 2. Sew together one light print 3" square, four dark print 2 ¼ x 3" rectangles, and four triangle-squares in three rows. Press seams toward rectangles. Join rows to make dark Churn Dash subunit. Press seams toward center row. The dark Churn Dash subunit should be 6 ½" square including seam allowances. Repeat to make a second dark subunit.



The blue stars represent the dark print fabric. This diagram is of the Churn Dash subunit and is not drawn to exact scale due to my limited computer skills and program. \bigcirc Sorry, Joni.

- 3. Sew light print large triangles to opposite edges of a dark Churn Dash subunit. Press seams toward triangles. Sew light print large triangles to remaining edges to make a dark Churn Dash center. Press seams toward triangles and trim dark Churn Dash center to 9" square including seam allowances. Repeat to the other dark subunit.
- 4. Use a pencil to draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of eight dark blue print 3" squares. Align a marked dark blue print square with one corner of a dark Churn Dash center. Sew on drawn line. Trim excess, leaving ¼" seam allowance. Press open attached triangle. Repeat to add marked squares to remaining three corners of dark Churn Dash center to make a dark block. The block should be 9" square including seam allowances. Repeat to finish the other dark Churn Dash block.
- 5. Repeat Steps 1-4 with your light and dark positions reversed to make two light blocks. You should end up with four 9" blocks.




