# Winter/Spring Workshops

June In Person Workshops, The Pizza Girls (The Quilters Gallery) – 6/17 and 6/18 The Quilter's Gallery was a full service quilt shop run by Patti Cline and Cindy Page in Charlotte, NC for over 25 years. They closed their shop in 2006 and are doing quilt shows, guild programs and workshops. They got the nickname, "The Pizza Girls" because of their fabric packaging. Their specialty is making kits, coordinating fabrics for maximum impact for each project and packaging them to look like pizzas.

15 Degrees – Friday 6/17: Member \$55 & Non-member \$75 15 degrees is something a little different. It looks like curves, but everything is straight sewing. \$20 kit includes 15 degree ruler, 9" Stack and Whack), fabric strips for two blocks and an e-pattern. The class covers the basic technique and demo other wedge rulers – from miniature blocks to a 48" centerpiece. Appropriate for beginners.





Jack's Chain – Saturday 6/18: Member \$55 & Non-member \$75

Everyone loves this quilt. This was Cindy's pandemic quilt. Yes, you can make one too. You will need to do some prep work before class and the quilt has Y seams. Each quilter will need to make some 9-patches before class. \$29.95 person for the templates and pattern. Appropriate for more experienced quilters.



# **Block Party**

At the April meeting we collected the tulip blocks that were distributed in March. Twenty -eight blocks were returned, and we had two winners – Debbie Femia and Jan Vincent. Congratulations to you both! Please check with us next month to see if any more tulip blocks were returned.

Our May block is a flower basket. We provided the background fabric and two shades of blue for the basket. Participants will select their favorite flower-friendly fabric(s) for the flowers.

In addition, this month we have a CHALLENGE block, which is also a flower basket, but is more difficult. We did not provide printed directions; directions were emailed to participants and posted on Facebook. Swatches of background fabric were provided but are not required to be used for participation; participants can use their own background (white or cream) and must also use their own fabric for the basket and the flowers. There is no layout diagram for cutting any of the fabrics. In addition to winning the blocks, the lucky winner will get a prize! If you would still like to participate, just email Jan and bring your correctly completed block to the May meeting.

We are starting to plan for next year's Block Party theme and have an idea in mind – state blocks, and we want your input. We are planning to do North Carolina as one of the monthly blocks but want to hear what other states' blocks you would like to do, so we will have a vote next month so that you can pick your favorite state blocks. Choices will be limited to those that we think can be made by all participants, so no curves, no paper piecing and limited applique. We may, however, have a challenge block or two next year! Be sure to stop by the block party table next month to cast your vote!

In July there will be a prize for the member who has made the most Block Party blocks for the year. Also, if you have been or are still planning to make a sampler quilt from all twelve blocks, please plan to bring it to show and tell in July. Even if you only have a quilt top done that's fine! This is something you can still work on even now, because all the patterns we've already presented are posted on the guild website, are in the monthly newsletters, and are on Facebook. There will also be a prize drawing from the members who completed sampler quilts.



#### **May Flower Basket Block**

#### **Materials Needed:**


# Fabric 1. White or Cream (cutting diagram below):

- A Five 4 ¼ inch squares, cut in half on the diagonal to form triangles
- B Two 6 ½ x 3 ½ inch rectangles
- C One 3 ½ inch square



#### Fabric 2A. Blue (cutting diagram below):

- D One 3 ½ inch square
- E One 4 ¼ inch square, cut in half on the diagonal to form triangles



# Fabric 2B. Blue (Correct size provided to you)

F One 4 ¼ inch square, cut in half on the diagonal to form triangles

# Fabric 3 (Your choice – the example used two shades of the same color)

G Three to four 4 ¼ inch squares, cut in half on the diagonal (if you use two different colors, cut two squares of each color)



Note: Squares will be made from the 4 ¼ inch triangles, and will be trimmed to 3 ½ inch squares

#### Step 1: Make the squares

Lay out all pieces as shown to the right. Select all of the A, E, F and G triangles and pair each of the A (white or cream) triangles


with one of the other triangles. Stitch each set of triangles, and press each seam toward the color.

The squares must be trimmed to 3 ½ inch squares. To do so, align the square on your cutting mat at the junction of the 45 degree angle and horizontal and vertical lines forming a right angle, with all the raw edges of the square beyond the right angle lines, as shown below left. Using your ruler, cut the top and right sides to slightly more than 3 ½ inches using your ruler to measure, so that you have fabric left to trim on the other two sides. Then rotate the square 180 degrees, and cut what are now the new upper and right sides to 3 ½ inches (below center). Be sure to always keep the diagonal seam line on the 45 degree angle line on your cutting board. The result should be a 3 ½ inch square, as shown below right

### **May Flower Basket Block (Continued)**

Arrange the pieces as shown below left. Stitch together the three squares on the top row. Press the seams in one direction. Stitch together the three squares on the second row; press the seams in the opposite direction from the top row. Stitch together all four squares in the third row; press the seams in the opposite direction from row two. Stitch together the two squares in the bottom row; press the seams in the opposite direction from row three. See the photo below center.

Next stitch the two top rows of three squares together; press the seam to one side. Nest the seams so that they match neatly. Stitch the white rectangle to the two seamed rows. Press the seam to the opposite direction from the seam directly below.

Next stitch the bottom rectangle to the two seamed squares; press the seam in the same direction as the other seam. Stitch the bottom two rows together. Nest the seams so that they match neatly. Press the seam to one side.

To finish, stitch the top and bottom rectangles together. Pres the seam to one side

#### May Flower Basket Challenge Block

#### **Notes - PLEASE READ**

- Pieces for all the triangles are cut larger than needed and will be trimmed once they are sewn into squares
- Trimming and squaring are musts for this pattern, and are noted in the directions below
- Here is a You Tube tutorial on trimming half-square triangles if you need help doing this:

(How To Trim Half Square Triangle Blocks, with Rebecca Bryan)



#### **Materials Needed:**

#### Fabric 1. White:


- A Two 2 ½ inch squares
- B Two 2 ½ x 8 ½ inch rectangles
- C Five 3 inch squares, cut in half on the diagonal they will be trimmed to size after they are sewn to Fabric 2 or 3 triangles

#### Fabric 2. Blue:

- D One 7 inch right angle triangle it will be trimmed to size after it is attached to the flowers
- E One 3 inch square, cut in half on the diagonal they will be trimmed to size after they are sewn to Fabric 1 triangles Fabric 3 (a fat eighth is enough fabric)
- F Ten 2 ½ inch squares
- G Six 3 inch squares, cut in half on the diagonal (you will have one extra triangle) they will be trimmed to size after they are sewn to Fabric 1 triangles

#### Step 1: Create the Flowers

Lay out all the block pieces as shown to the right. Arrange the flowers in a way that looks best to you. Stitch all the white Fabric 1 triangles to the Fabric 3 flower triangles or the blue Fabric 2 triangles. Press seams toward the flower or blue fabric. TRIM each square to 2 ½ inches. Then lay out the squares again as shown next page, right. Sew the flower squares and flower/background squares together by row; press seams in alternating directions by row so that you can nest the seams when the rows are stitched together. Note: the triangles at the end of the rows will extend past the squares when they are seamed together, and will need to be trimmed. Line up the square/triangle combination as shown next page below left, with the seam at the junction of the 45 degree angle and vertical lines on your cutting mat. TRIM the excess off the triangle, as shown. Once these triangles are trimmed, seam the rows of flowers and background/flowers together. Press seams in the same direction.

### **May Flower Basket Challenge Block (Continued)**

#### Step 2: Attach the Basket

Lay out the flower piece and the basket as shown near right. Stitch the triangle to the basket; the points of the triangle should extend evenly beyond each end of the flower piece. Stitch; press the seam toward the basket. This piece should be TRIMMED to a 10 ½ inch square before proceeding. (The triangle piece at least will need to be trimmed.) See far right for the final piece.





#### Step 3: Finish the Block

Attach the Fabric 1 B pieces (8 ½ x

2 ½) to the basket/background squares, aligning as shown near right. Press seams toward the background. See the far right photo for what you should have now.

Then sew the right long panel to the bottom square. Press seam toward the basket triangle piece. Then sew the bottom long panel to the basket; press seam toward the bottom piece. Attach the two remaining pieces together; press seam toward the right side panel.





Congratulations, you have made your May Flower Challenge Basket!!

## One Quilter's Experience

## By Darlene Silverman

Disclaimer: I do not hold myself out as an expert. I know that many of you know so much more than I do. I share my experience in the hope of helping newer quilters as well as to stimulate conversation among more experienced quilters. I welcome feedback and differing views, as we are all on this journey together and can only benefit from hearing each other. (If you are reading this in the newsletter, please weigh in on Facebook.)

#### Making a Mitered Border

Some quilters <u>never</u> miter borders. If this is a considered design choice, because one has decided that flat borders are what is needed, then all is well and good. But if you are making flat borders because mitered borders seem to be too much trouble or because you have not had success in the past, then do give them a (or another) try. The effect of a mitered border is that of a frame. Your work of art deserves a frame. The following is a mitering demo done for a Guild demo day. I was asked to put it in writing and gave out copies at that time. So this may not be new info for you, but I hope it is helpful to some.

In the example below, I frame out a 12" block with a 2" mitered border. Keep in mind that borders are not only for use on the outer edges of a quilt. A framed block can be used anywhere on a quilt top.

1. Measure the <u>finished</u> length of quilt top. My sample block is 12" square, finished. Determine the <u>finished</u> width of the border you want. My sample border is 2" wide, finished. Cut 4 border pieces to your dimensions:

```
{finished border width + ½"} x
{finished edge of quilt top + (width of border x 2) + 1"}

My sample:
{2" + ½"} x
{12" + 4" + 1"}

2½" x 17" (There will be a little bit of extra length to the border.)
```

I cut 4 strips of border fabric 2½" x 18".

For each edge of the quilt, do the following:

2. Fold border in half to find the center point and mark clearly with a dot ¼" from edge. Measure and clearly mark a dot ½ the finished length of the quilt top to each side of the center mark and ¼" from the edge. My sample dots are 6" to each side of the center mark.

If you are making a long border, add more matching points to ensure even placement.

- 3. Mark a clear dot on all 4 corners of the quilt top ¼" from each edge.
- 4. Place the border right sides together with quilt top. Pin-match the center dots. Carefully pin-match the outside dots. Begin and end your stitching exactly on the outside dots. Stitch forward and then back on each end to secure. 45 degrees Press seam allowance to border.

Repeat with the three remaining borders and three remaining quilt top sides. At each corner of the quilt top, where two of these seams meet, your stitch lines should end in the same hole -- at the dot. Pin adjoining borders away from where you are working, so as to avoid catching unwanted border fabric in your stitching.

On each overhanging strip end, carefully mark a 45 degree line from the edge of the fabric to the end of the stitch line (the dot). Align the 45 degree mark of your ruler to the fabric edge.

Right sides together, pin-match two adjoining borders along the lengths of your drawn diag-

onal lines. Sew on the drawn line. Begin your stitching exactly at the end of your previous stitch lines, stitching forward and then backstitching to secure, and sewing out the edge at the other side, backstitching to secure. Trim seam allowances to ¼" and press seam allowance open. Trim dog ears.

Next up: Disciplining my inner 5-year-old
