Her lecture is called "Batting: What's Inside Matters" and will cover many different topics including how to select the best batting for your project, pros and cons of various fiber types, proper use and care of batting and quilts, tips and tricks for best results, bearding and so much more. This lecture will be presented via Zoom at the meeting and will be projected onto the screens for everyone to enjoy.

Next, classes for the fall are filling up and we encourage you to register early. All of these classes are in-person. In August, we will welcome Nina Clotfelter who will be teaching 2 quilting classes. In September, the guild will offer a Barn Quilt Paint class. And in October, we will welcome Cynthia England with 2 picture piecing classes. President's Challenge-2023

A View Through My Window

"A short story is what you see when you look out of the window." - Mavis Gallant

This year, I challenge our quilt guild members to create a window scene either looking in or out of a window. All the windows will have the same frame and measure 18"x30". A piece of Kona Jet Black fabric, which was donated by Bernina World of Sewing, will be provided as well as a pattern for the window frame. All styles of quilting are welcomed, and the goal is to hang them at the 2023 Capital Quilters Guild Quilt Show as if you are looking into or out of an apartment building. Please join me in creating what is sure to be a beautiful installation.

The Rules....

- 1. The finished quilt must measure 18" wide by 30" long.
- 2. While supplies last, each member will be provided a piece of Kona Jet Black fabric which should be used as the window frame. Additional Kona Jet Black fabric can be purchased at your local quilt shop for windowpane dividers/mullions/grilles/muntins.
- 3. The quilt must be finished with a binding which should be the same fabric as the window frame (Kona Jet Black) or by finishing your edges by adding facing to the quilt (i.e. using a pillowcase method.) Please note that to be eligible for judging, quilting must be seen on the back of the quilt. Additional fabric for the binding can be purchased at your local quilt shop
- 4. All quilts must satisfy all requirements as set forth by the 2023 Quilt Show Rules and must have a sleeve following those specifications.
- 5. Quilts will be due by the 2023 Capital Quilters Quilt Show Entry Deadline. Exact due dates will be published once the quilt show committee announces them. Please know that having your project judged is OPTIONAL. Please feel free participate within the category as a non-judged quilt. However, all non-judged quilts must be registered by the quilt show entry deadline and submitted by preview day.



2023 Quilt Show Committee Leads and 2024 Shadow Leads Required

Just a reminder! We are still looking or volunteers for Committee Leads for this year's quilt show and Shadow Leads for next year's show.

Descriptions for each of these positions can be found on the following pages.

So, what do we need for our next show in 2023?

- 1. Our Advertising Committee Lead has been filled by Marlene Jordan (Thank you!) but we are still in *urgent need* the for Ribbon Committee Lead(s).
- 2. We are also in need of shadow committee leads for all committees for 2023 that will then be Committee Lead(s) for the 2024 show. This is a great way to learn the responsibilities and assist the current Committee Lead without having any of the responsibility!!

If you have any questions about any of the committees, please feel free to also email me or call me at 617-849-0705 or speak with any of the current committee leads.

Quilt Show Committee Chair Responsibilities

<u>Quilt Show Co-Chairs</u> – the quilt show co-chair tasks have been split into two groups – one co-chair is responsible for all committees requiring contract signatures (such as, fairgrounds contract, pipe and drape contract, vendor contracts and judging contracts). This co-chair is also responsible for all communication with those groups. The second co-chair is responsible for all committees that have tasks at the actual quilt show (such as quilt registration, ribbons, boutique, hanging and take down).

Vendor Committee Lead(s) – this committee is responsible for soliciting vendors for the show, getting vendor contracts signed, tracking deposits and payments, all correspondence with vendors and providing the quilt show co-chair with information on vendor requirements for electricity, chairs, tables.

<u>Judging Committee Lead(s)</u> – this committee is responsible for soliciting judges for the quilts, getting judging contracts signed, confirming accuracy/changes of quilt categories, number of awards, managing the quilt prep and quilt judging days, preparing the final list of award winners and attaching ribbons to the quilts at the quilt show.

Quilt Registration and Intake Committee Lead(s) – this committee is responsible for confirming or changing the quilt registration sign up document, opening (posting) quilt registration and closing (removing) quilt registration on the website, scheduling quilt pick up day or days and locations, managing the location of quilts for the show, making sure the quilts are at the quilt prep day and judging day and managing the drop off at the quilt show of all quilts. Also, to provide judging committee, hanging committee and brochure committees with the final registrations.

<u>Charity Auction Committee Lead(s)</u> - this committee is responsible for soliciting a charity group to partner with the Guild. This person is also responsible for providing a theme for the charity partner silent auction quilts to be donated. The charity auction chair also is responsible for preparing the silent auction paperwork and to hang the silent auction quilts at the quilt show.

<u>Boutique Committee Lead(s)</u> – this committee is responsible for collecting all items donated to the guild for the quilt show boutique, pricing the items, set up and take down at the quilt show.

<u>Publicity Committee Lead(s)</u> - this committee is responsible for creating and having printed flyers made for quilt shops and at raffle quilt events, prepare advertisement in the County Register, posting on WRAL Out and About calendar, Visit Raleigh website and Quiltinghub.com and other sites that may be appropriate. Also, emails in January and February to NC, SC and VA quilt guilds.

<u>Volunteer Committee Lead(s)</u> – this committee is responsible for soliciting volunteers for all of the committees that require them prior to and at the quilt show. This committee is responsible for tracking the volunteers, emailing all volunteers just prior to the show reminding each volunteer of their time slots they signed up for, posting in the December/January newsletter the requirements of each volunteer slot, and providing a final alphabetical list of volunteers for the ticket sales window to check off volunteers when they receive their free ticket to the show.

<u>Quilt Hanging Committee Lead(s)</u> – this committee is responsible for preparing the hanging layout based on the number of pipe and drape allotted. Based on this layout, committee will provide to the co-chair the number of pipe and drape required and other hanging items. Also responsible for determining number of volunteers required to hang the quilts based on the number of quilts submitted.

<u>Quilt Take Down Lead(s)</u> – this committee is responsible for the take down process, plastic bags required for all quilts submitted. This committee will work closely with the quilt registration committee and the quilt judging committee to be sure all registrants receive their judging forms and receive back all of their submitted quilts.

Ribbon Committee Lead(s) – this committee is responsible for preparing all of the award-winning ribbons and special ribbons awarded by the judges. Sue Dressler and Katie Greenwood have great suggestions for next year to spread out the time-consuming work of creating these ribbons throughout our entire guild membership. The committee will be responsible for tracking the creating of these ribbons and the quality of the ribbons created.

<u>On-Line Quilt Show Brochure</u> – this committee is responsible for preparing the online brochure using the QR code. The brochure includes list of all entrants, list of award winners, information on judging, etc. Joni Amerson created this year's brochure which is excellent and a great template to use for future quilt shows.

Block Party

At our June meeting we collected twelve sunshine blocks, which were won by Maria Kleinman. Congratulations Maria!

Our block for June is a flag block. The directions were posted on Facebook, on the website and are shown below. We did, however, run out of fabric swatches, distributing 30! Starting in July the year's block party theme will be state blocks. We will be making blocks for the following states: North Carolina, New York, Massachusetts, Alabama, Illinois, Ohio, South Carolina, New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Colorado, Rhode Island, Mississippi, and Kentucky. We will be looking at ways to present other blocks that were not included in this list during the year.

At the July meeting there will be a prize for the member who has made the most Block Party blocks for the year. Also, if you have made a sampler quilt from the year's blocks, please email Jan at jchvatal2@gmail.com. Then stop by the Block Party Table to let us know that you are participating. Even if you only have a quilt top done that's fine! There will also be a prize drawn from the members who completed sampler quilts.

June Flag Block

Materials Needed:

Fabric 1. Red (provided)

A. Two 4 ¼ inch squares, cut on the diagonal

B. Two 3 ½ x 1 ½ inch rectangles


C. One 3 ½ in square

4% x 414

Fabric 2. Blue (provided)

D. Two 4 ¼ inch squares, cut on the diagonal

E. One 6 ½ x 1 ½ inch rectangle





Fabric

3. White (from your stash)

Four 4 % inch squares, cut on the diagonal Four 3 % inch squares One 3 % x 1 % inch rectangle

34 1/2

612 × 11/2

3/2 × 1/2

Step 1: Make the center flag

Two 6 ½ x 1 ½ inch rectangles

Select all fabric pieces 1B, 1C, 2E, 3H and 3I. Arrange as shown below left. Stitch together the 3 ½ inch red and white strips; press seams toward the red. Stitch together the 6 ½ inch red and white strips; press seams toward the red.

Arrange as shown below center. Stitch the blue square and the 3 ½ inch red and white striped square together. Press seam toward the blue square. See photo below right. Stitch top and bottom rectangles together. Press seam toward the top section.







Step 2: Make the half square triangles

Select all triangles made from the 4 ¼ inch squares cut on the diagonal: 1A, 2D and 3F, as shown below left. Pair each white triangle with either a red or blue triangle, right sides together. Stitch each pair on the long diagonal line. Press seams toward the colored fabric. TRIM each triangle to a 3 ½ inch square. Place seam on the diagonal line on your cutting board in order to keep the seam in the appropriate position. Trim the top and right sides; rotate 180 degrees and repeat. See below right.

June Flag Block (continued)

Step 3: Finish the block

Arrange the pieces as shown below left. Be sure to orient and arrange the red/white and blue/white squares correctly. Pair up each red/white square with its neighbor blue/white square. With right sides together, stitch along the appropriate white edge to form rectangles. Press the seams of the top, left and bottom rectangles toward the blue; press the right rectangle seam toward the red.

Arrange pieces as shown below, center. Stitch the white corner squares to the top and bottom center rectangles. Press seams toward the white squares.

Press the side rectangles to the center flag square; press seams toward the flag.

Arrange pieces as shown below, right. Stitch top row to center flag; press toward the top row. Stitch bottom row to center flag; press toward the flag piece.







One Quilter's Experience

Disclaimer: I do not hold myself out as an expert. I know that many of you know so much more than I do. I share my experience in the hope of helping newer quilters as well as to stimulate conversation among more experienced quilters. I welcome feedback and differing views, as we are all on this journey together and can only benefit from hearing each other. (If you are reading this in the newsletter, please weigh in on Facebook.)

<u>Education — filling your toolbox</u>

You wouldn't try to build a house, bake a cake or put together an Ikea bookcase without the requisite tools. In addition to the physical tools of hammer and screwdriver, measuring cups and mixer, you want to bring the skill sets needed to use your physical toolbox effectively — your mental toolbox, so to speak.

As we educate ourselves — taking classes, reading books, watching videos, learning from our talented friends (my personal favorite!) — we fill our toolboxes. Every opportunity we take to learn something new, every time we try a new technique, every new gadget that learn to use, we are gathering what we need to become better, more competent quilters. We open out our options. This is a gift to our future selves — an investment with ongoing and ever-increasing returns.

Ultimately, my own goal is to be able to take whatever is in my head and translate it into fabric and thread. I don't want to have to say to myself, "Alas, I have no way to turn this mental image into a quilt. I will have to settle for some scaled down, less interesting, less satisfying version of my idea." The better you have filled your toolbox, the more options you will have and the less likely it is that you will have to settle.

When considering a class, don't only look at the project itself, also consider whether something about the process interests you. I certainly take classes for a project, but more often I take classes that focus on a technique I can learn or in which I want to improve (or, frankly, just to spend a day hangin' with quilters!). Also, in my experience, instructors rarely speak only to the immediate and will drop nuggets of information that may be helpful across your quilting experience. Cutting, piecing, appliqué, and pressing skills learned for one project can certainly translate to any project. Most instructors offer suggestions and tricks in other areas as well and are quite open to all sorts of questions, whether or not they apply to the project at hand. Even a class on the simplest of projects can be rewarding.

One Quilter's Experience (continued)

I am still old-school enough to love the look and feel of the printed page. I never cease learning from my collection of books on quilting. I will return to them, time and again, for education and inspiration. I have learned much from magazines, as well. Unfortunately, there are not as many quilt magazines as there once were and my own favorite, Machine Quilting Unlimited, stopped publishing a while ago, but I know that there are still quilt magazines being published from which one can learn.

I had purchased a few patterns from the previous iteration of Craftsy and was disappointed when it folded. I signed up when it was resurrected and have enjoyed watching many of the available instructional videos. National (and international) quilters from whom you might otherwise never have the opportunity to learn can be found in the magical world of the internet.

I have not been a big watcher of YouTube, but I have seen a number of helpful videos by quilters and know it to be a rich source of information. I intend to invest a bit more time in exploring the quilty-universe of you tube in future.

As always, I learn more from my friends than from any other source. Nothing is more impactful than quilts created before your eyes by friends who share their problems and solutions.

There are so many opportunities to learn. Where do you find the tools to fill your mental toolbox with the skills you need? Is there a particular class, instructor, book or video that has made a big difference to you? Please share!
