2023 President's Challenge


Finished Size: 18"x30"


Pattern Notes:

All pieces listed below are unfinished.

Use a ¼" seam allowance.

Fabric: Kona Jet Black #114





Cutting Instructions: While supplies last, the guild is providing a 5" piece of 60" wide Kona Jet Black. (These instructions are based on a 60" WOF)

From the 5" piece provided, subcut into 2 - 2 %" strips.

Subcut 1 of the 2 ½" strips into

2 – 26 ½" strips (Piece B)

Subcut 1 of the 2 ½" strips into

 $2-18 \frac{1}{2}$ " strip (Piece A) be sure to leave a strip that

will yield one piece to be 14 1/2" long

1-14 ½" strip

Trim the 14 %" x 2 %" strip to 14 %" x 1 %" (Piece D - for center sashing of widow) The 2 inside sections of the window (the top and bottom of the window) will equal 14 %" W x 13" H (Piece C).

Assembly:

- 1. After completing Pieces C (the top and bottom of the view in/out of your window), connect/join them by sewing Piece D between them. Press seam allowances towards the black fabric.
- 2. Add Pieces B (1 to each of the right and left sides) as a Left and Right Border/window frame. Press seam allowances towards the black fabric.
- 3. Add Pieces A (1 to the top and 1 to the bottom) as the top and bottom border/window frame. Press seam allowances towards the black fabric.
- 4. Finish the quilt either by binding the quilt with Kona Jet Black Fabric or by facing the quilt. The quilt must also have a sleeve and label following the specifications set by the 2023 Quilt Show Rules.
 (NOTE: For display purposes, the Kona Jet Black fabric must be the final element at all outside edges of the quilt.)

A View Through My Window - President's Challenge 2023

"A short story is what you see when you look out of the window." -Mavis Gallant

This year, I challenge our quilt guild members to create a window scene either looking in or out of a window. All the windows will have the same frame and measure 18"x30". A piece of Kona Jet Black fabric, which was donated by Bernina World of Sewing, will be provided as well as a pattern for the window frame. All styles of quilting are welcomed, and the goal is to hang them at the 2023 Capital Quilters Guild Quilt Show as if you are looking into or out of an apartment building. Please join me in creating what is sure to be a beautiful installation.

The Rules....

- 1. The finished quilt must measure 18" wide by 30" long.
- 2. While supplies last, each member will be provided a piece of Kona Jet Black fabric which should be used as the window frame. Additional Kona Jet Black fabric can be purchased at your local quilt shop for windowpane dividers/mullions/grilles/muntins.
- 3. The quilt must be finished with a binding which should be the same fabric as the window frame (Kona Jet Black) or by finishing your edges by adding facing to the quilt (i.e. using a pillowcase method.) Please note that to be eligible for judging, quilting must be seen on the back of the quilt. Additional fabric for the binding can be purchased at your local quilt shop.
- 4. All quilts must satisfy all requirements as set forth by the 2023 Quilt Show Rules and must have a sleeve following those specifications.
- 5. Quilts will be due by the 2023 Capital Quilters Quilt Show Entry Deadline. Exact due dates will be published once the quilt show committee announces them. Please know that having your project judged is OPTIONAL. Please feel free participate within the category as a non-judged quilt. However, all non-judged quilts must be registered by the quilt show entry deadline and submitted by preview day.

6. Participation is for 2022-2023 Capital Quilt Guild Members only.


Hello Members,

Spring 2023 Workshops

Kelly Ashton, April 21 & 22 - \$55 members and \$75 non-members

As a self-described "pragmatic quilt-maker", Kelly Ashton approaches quilt design and construction with a knowledge of and appreciation for the theoretical while searching for and developing skills and short-cuts that are practical. Kelly's passion for patchwork covers a dichotomy between "microwave quilts" (quilts that are simple in design and quick to piece) to "crock-pot quilts" (quilts that are more intricate and complex in their construction), and she happily moves back and forth betwixt the two....and everything in-between! Kelly is the author of Hexagons, Diamonds, Triangles, and More: Skill-Building Techniques for 60-Degree Patch-



work, and her obsession with 60-degree patchwork continues. In addition to designing quilts, Kelly especially loves to teach and talk about quilts. Her motto is "Have quilts. Will travel."

Kelly is a Bernina Ambassador and some of her classes can also be found on the Craftsy website (https://www.craftsy.com). Kelly resides in Overland Park, KS, USA with her husband, Jeff Seib. In addition to quilty things, Kelly owns and operates The Creative Place, a retreat for quilters and other artists located in Spring Hill, KS.

On Friday, April 21 Kelly will be teaching Tumbling Blocks which is a wonderful study in color and value, in addition to being the perfect learning ground for set-in seams! The kit fee is \$20 and includes templates. Skill level – confident beginner and beyond.



On Saturday, April 22 Kelly will be teaching Painted Mountains a beautiful project that explores color, proportion, and an unusual setting with no Y seams. The kit fee is \$25 and includes templates required for the pattern. Skill level – confident beginner and beyond.


Sharon will be offering 2 workshops, Friday May 19 and Saturday May 20, teaching Singer Featherweight owners how to maintain their machines.



Block Party

This year's theme for block party is state blocks.

In December we had a block party extravaganza, with kits for three blocks given out. There was an easy block from Mississippi, a medium level block from Rhode Island, and a challenge block from Kentucky. Fifteen of the 19 Mississippi blocks were returned; the winner for these was Karen Wahle. All twelve Rhode Island blocks were returned and were won by Debby Femia, who also received a prize for completing the challenge block. Ten of the 12 Kentucky blocks were returned, and were won by Kim Zebrowski, along with a challenge block prize as well. Congratulations to our winners! If you were unable to return your block at the January meeting, please plan to return it at the February meeting.

January's block is from Colorado. There are no official state colors for Colorado, but their state flag is blue (for the sky), white (for the snowcapped mountains), gold (for the sunshine), and red (for the soil). The fabric for this block is blue and white. All 32 kits were distributed.

Colorado State Block

Materials Needed:


Fabrics 1 and 2: One strip of white and one strip of light blue

(4 x 32 inches each)

Eight 4 inch squares of each fabric

4 x 4	4 x 4	4 x 4	4 x 4	4 x 4	4 x 4	4 x 4	4 x 4

Notes: Cut the squares carefully – you have just enough fabric to cut eight 4 inch squares. Be sure to trim the squares in Photo 4 to 3 ½ inches as needed.



Step 1

Mark a white square with a diagonal line, as shown in Photo 1. Sandwich the white square with a blue square, right sides together. Stitch ¼ inch away from the line on either side of the line, as shown in photo 2. Then cut on the drawn line. See photo 3. Press each seam toward the blue fabric. Trim each square to 3 ½ inches as needed. See photo 4. Repeat with all squares.










Step 2

Lay out all half square triangles as shown in photo 5 below. Sew strips together by row. Be sure to match the corner diagonal seams. Press each row's seams in an alternating direction to make it easier to seam the rows. See photo 6. Seam row 1 to row 2, matching seams (straight and diagonal). Press the seam in one direction. Seam row 3 to row 4, matching seams (straight and diagonal). Press the seam in the same direction. See photo 7. Seam the top to the bottom, matching seams (straight and diagonal). Press the seam in the same direction as the other two seams

One Quilter's Experience

I do not hold myself out as an expert. I know that many of you know so much more than I do. I share my experience in the hope of helping newer quilters as well as to stimulate conversation among more experienced quilters. I welcome feedback and differing views, as we are all on this journey together and can only benefit from hearing each other. (If you are reading this in the newsletter, please weigh in on Facebook.)

Charity (Comfort) Quilts

There are lots of reasons to love this Guild — the people, the workshops, the people, the library, the people, the quilt show, and . . . did I mention the rather fabulous people?

Once, my brother (who is prone to such random, yet probing questions) asked me, "What two qualities best define quilters?" I answered almost immediately, "Generosity and a high tolerance for tedium." The generosity of spirit that I see in quilters is what I love best. I have always been blown away by both the quantity and the quality of the quilts produced by members of this Guild — not just to keep, not just to give to their own families and loved-ones, but also to give to complete strangers in order to make their lives a little bit better, a little bit warmer and a little bit more beautiful.

The Remnants Bee, of which I am fortunate to be a member, did a two-year stint running Quilts on Wheels. I loved the intake — getting to admire and pet all of the wonderful works of so many of your hands and hearts. However, it was the outgo that made my heart sing. It was truly a joyous experience to go to a different nursing home each month and actually hand over to residents the quilts made by Guild members. The smiles elicited from the nursing home residents — their delight and appreciation — is something I will carry for the rest of my life.

On a personal level, making comfort quilts is not just good for our souls and/or karma, but also allows those of us who need it (e.g., me!) additional practice to improve our skills. There is that old saw that you have to spend 10,000 hours doing something in order to become proficient. I do not know if there is verifiable experimental data to back up that suspiciously round number, but let's agree that, prodigies aside, practice definitely helps! Why not get some of that practice while helping others?

Attending a Comfort Quilt Workshop is a fun way to participate. Making a comfort quilt in a social setting is a win/win! Hang out with old friends, make new ones, make a quick top from a pre-cut kit — what's not to like? The occasional door prize is just a cherry-on-top bonus.

One Quilter's Experience (Continued)

I admit that I have been remiss lately in my own production of comfort quilts and am resolved after the upcoming quilt show to devote more time to making some. I know there are so many of you who devote your valuable time to making lovely quilts for the Guild's comfort quilt programs. Whether you donate the occasional quilt or you are a one-person comfort quilt factory, I hope you know how much of a difference your generosity makes in a recipient's life.
