## Materials Needed:

## Fabric 1: White

A. Eight 2 inch squares
B. Two $6 \frac{1}{2}$ inch $\times 21 / 2$ inch rectangles
C. One $12 \frac{1}{2}$ inch $\times 21 / 2$ inch rectangle


Fabric 3: Blue
F. Four 2 inch squares
G. Four $31 / 2 \times 2$ inch rectangles
H. One $31 / 2$ inch square

## Fabric 2: Red

D. One $6 \frac{1}{2}$ inch $\times 2 \frac{1}{2}$ inch rectangle
E. Two $121 / 2 \times 21 / 2$ inch rectangles


Block size: $121 / 2$ inches unfinished

## Step 1: Make the Star

Mark all the A squares (wrong side) on the diagonal, as shown in photo 1. Using four of the A squares and the four G rectangles, place one square on each of the rectangles, right sides together, as shown in photo 2 . Stitch and trim to $1 / 4$ inch. Press toward the white. Using the remaining A squares, place one on each of the photo 2 units, as shown in photo 3. Stitch, trim to $1 / 4$ inch and press toward the white.

Using the flying geese units, the F squares, and the H square, lay out as shown in photo 4. Stitch together the top three pieces, the middle three pieces, and the bottom three pieces. Press the seams of the top and bottom rows toward the blue squares; press the middle row seams toward the large blue square. See photo 5 . Finally, seam together the top row to the middle row, and the middle row to the bottom row, nesting the seams. Press the seams to one side. See photo 6.
