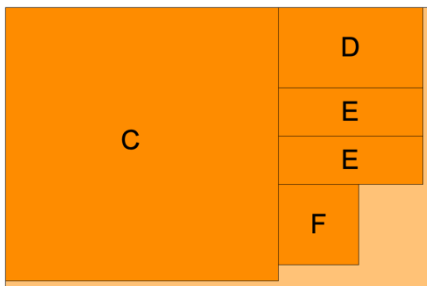


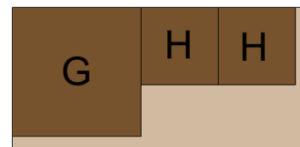
Background fabric cuts from

1 @ 13.25" x 8.75"

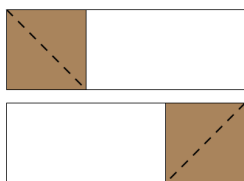
- C. 1 @ 8.5" x 8.5"
- D. 1 @ 4.5" x 2.5"
- E. 2 @ 4.5" x 1.5"
- F. 1 @ 2.5" x 2.5"



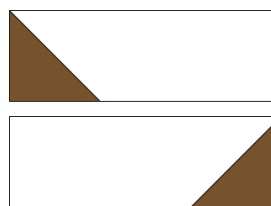
Skin fabric cuts from  
1 @ 5.75" x 2.75"

- G. 1 @ 2.5" x 2.5"
- H. 2 @ 1.5" x 1.5"

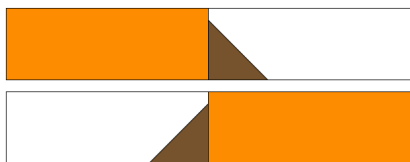
1. With right sides together, place an H square at one end of a B rectangle, aligning the edges. Sew on the diagonal of each square as shown. Be careful to get the angles correct.



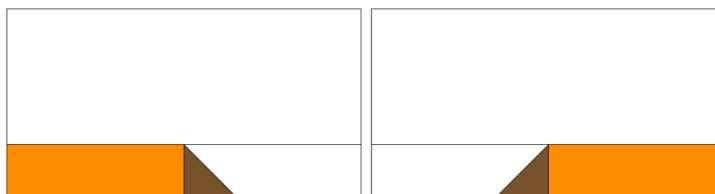
2. Trim the corners 0.25" away from your seams and press the seam towards the darker fabric.



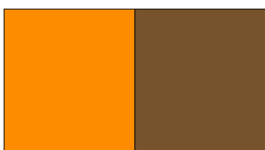
3. Sew an E rectangle to the short edge of each unit as shown. Press the seam towards the E fabric.



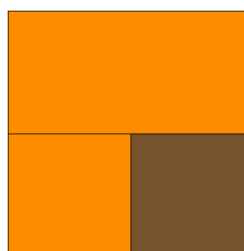
4. Sew an A rectangle to one edge of the previous unit, exactly as show.



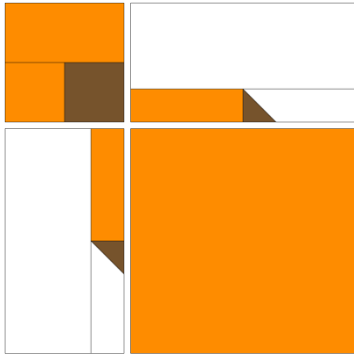
5. Sew the G square to the right-hand side of the F square.



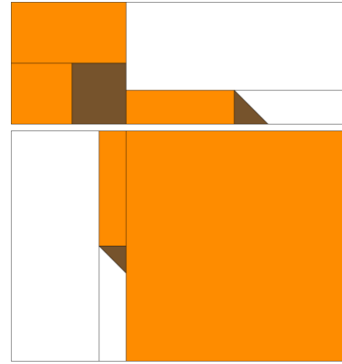
6. Sew the D rectangle to the top of the last unit.



6. Lay out the units as shown below.



7. Join the top two units, pressing the seam towards the left. Then join the bottom two units, pressing the seam towards the C fabric side.



8. Join the top to the bottom of the block.  
Your African Queen block should measure 12.5" square.
