

Background fabric cuts from 1 @ 10.5" x 8"
A. 12 @ $2.5^{\prime \prime} \times 2.5^{\prime \prime}$


Red fabric cuts from 1 @ 9" x 3"
B. 1 @ $8.5^{\prime \prime} \times 2.5^{\prime \prime}$


Yellow fabric cuts from
Green fabric cuts from
1 @ $13^{\prime \prime} \times 5.5^{\prime \prime}$
D. 2 @ $12.5^{\prime \prime} \times 2.5^{\prime \prime}$

1 @ 9" $\times 3^{\prime \prime}$
E. 1 @ $8.5^{\prime \prime} \times 2.5^{\prime \prime}$

1. Sew an $A$ square at either end of the $B$ and $E$ fabrics. Press the seams AWAY from the A squares.

2. Snowball each $C$ strip by placing an A square at either end, with right sides together, and sewing a diagonal line from corner to corner across each A square.
Trim off the excess $0.25^{\prime \prime}$ AWAY from the seams.
Press the seam towards the A fabric.
MAKE SURE your seam angles are EXACTLY as shown.
Make 2 identical units.
3. Repeat the process with the $D$ rectangles, so the you have 2 units in each colorway.

4. Layout all of your units as shown on the left.
5. Join the rows together. Your Japanese Lantern Star block should measure $12.5^{\prime \prime}$ square.

Press each row open.
