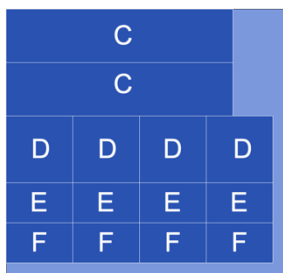


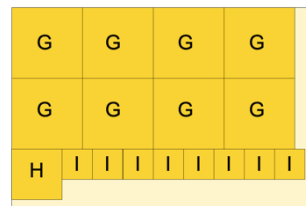
Background fabric cuts from

- B. 4 @ 6.5" x 3.5"



Blue fabric cuts from
1 @ 10.5" x 10"

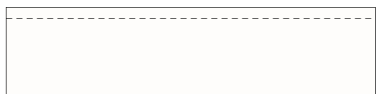
- C. 2 @ 2" x 8.5"
- D. 4 @ 2.5" x 2.5"
- E. 4 @ 2.5" x 1.5"
- F. 4 @ 2.5" x 1.5"



Yellow fabric cuts from
1 @ 15" x 10"

- G. 8 @ 3.5" x 3.5"
- H. 1 @ 2.5" x 2.5"
- I. 8 @ 1.5" x 1.5"

1. Place an A and C rectangle with right sides together. Sew a 0.25" seam along one long edge. Make a second strip with the other A and C rectangles.



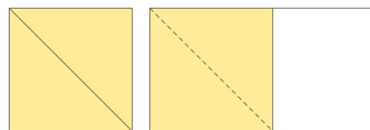
2. Press the seams towards the C fabric. Cut each strip into 2" wide units. You will get a total of 8 units from both strips.



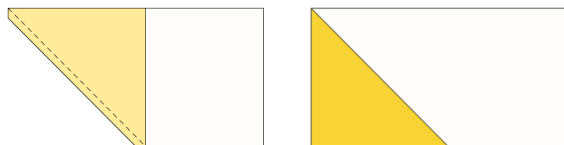
3. Make a 4-patch unit from 2 of the units as shown, nesting the seams carefully. Press the seam to one side. The unit should measure 3.5" square. Make a total of 4 units.



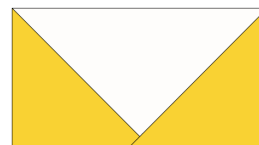
4. Draw a diagonal line on the wrong side of each G square. Make the large Flying Geese units by placing a G square at one end of a B rectangle with right side together. Sew on the drawn line.



5. Trim the corner 0.25" AWAY from the seam. Press the seam towards the G fabric.



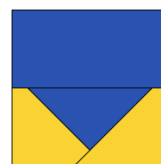
6. Repeat the process at the other end of the B rectangle. Make a total of 4 units. Each unit should measure 6.5" x 3.5".



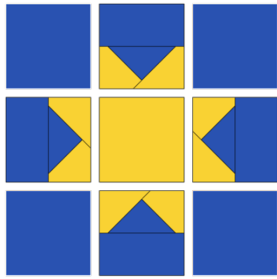
7. Following the previous 2 steps, make 4 more Flying Geese units, but this time with the E rectangles and I squares. These units should measure 2.5" x 1.5".



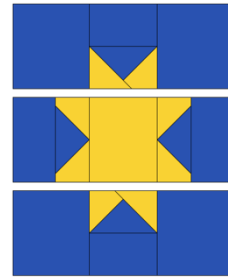
8. Sew an F rectangle to the top of each Flying Geese unit made in 7. Press the seams towards the F rectangles. These units should measure 2.5" square.



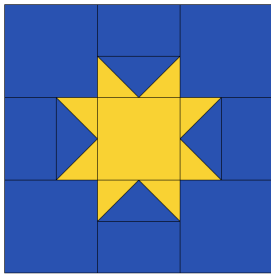
9. Lay out the units from 8, along with the D and H squares as shown below.



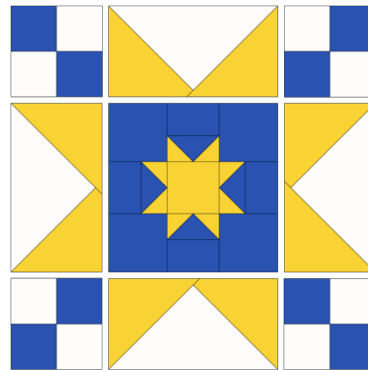
10. Join the rows, pressing the seams in the top and bottom rows away from the middle, and in the middle row, towards the center.



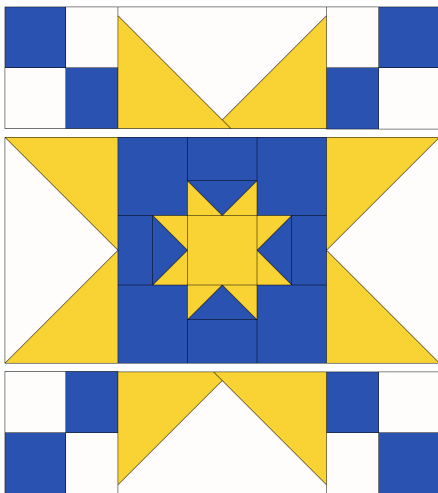
11. Join the rows to make the center unit. Make sure to nest the seams. Press each seam towards the center of the unit.



12. Lay out all of the units as shown below.



13. First join the rows of the block. Press these seams open.



14. Finally join the rows together, pressing these final seams open. Your Ukrainian Sunflower block should measure 12.5" square.
