**Special Exhibit - CQG President's Challenge 2021-2022, All Techniques**

Each year, the Guild President challenges Guild Members to create a quilt based on requirements set by the Guild President. The Capital Quilters Guild quilt show is the same weekend as the NC Museum of Art's annual Art in Bloom exhibition, where florists create arrangements inspired by a piece of art in the museum.

In a nod to the NC Museum of Art, this year's President's Challenge is to create a quilt inspired by flowers/gardens or by a piece of artwork. The quilts should be 96" or smaller in perimeter and should be bound with black or gold fabric provided by the Guild.

## Quilt Judging Basics – What’s with the ribbons?

In this show you will see Category Ribbons (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, Honorable Mention) and Cross-Category Ribbons (Best of Show, Judge’s Choice [1 per judge], Best Handwork, Best Computer-Guided Machine Quilting, Best Hand-Guided Machine Quilting, Innovation).

The judges also had the option to award four additional ribbons for quilts that are excellent exemplars of a particular aspect of quilt-making. (Examples: Best use of color, Best use of embellishments, Best use of humor in a quilt.)

There is one additional Cross-Category Ribbon – Viewers’ Choice, chosen by those who attend the show. That’s you!

### How is a quilt judged?

Two professional quilt judges evaluated all of the quilts entered for judging. They used the following criteria:

#### Visual Impact

##### Design

**Use of Color and Fabric** (visually pleasing, value contrast, scale of fabric)

**Use of Design/Pattern in quilt top** (balance, proportion, scale)

**Quilting design** (enhances top, appropriate density)

**Innovation/Creativity**

##### Workmanship

**Piecing technique** (smooth curves, sharp points, intersections match)

**Applique technique** (smooth curves, sharp points, stitches consistent)

**Quilting Technique** (even stitches, marking removed, tension balanced)

**Finishing** (borders straight and even, binding filled, corners accurate)

Basically the judges are looking for a well-planned, well-executed example of the quiltmaker’s art. Entrants receive evaluations and comments from the judges, which is an opportunity for the quilt maker to learn and improve.

## **Now you get to judge!**

Keep these things in mind as you look at the quilts in our show and see whether you agree with the judges' decisions! You don't have to use the same criteria as a professional quilt judge, but now you have some idea of how they evaluate a quilt. Now, which one do you like best?

Cast your vote for the Viewers' Choice Award.
