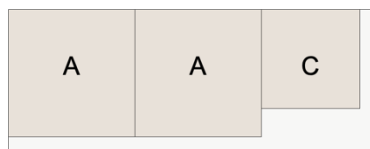
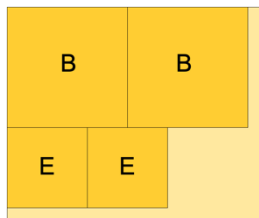


Note: Illustrations are not necessarily to scale. Each kit provides the fabric for 1 @ 12.5" block.

Fabric 1 (BG) cut from 1 @ 13" x 5"

- A. 2 @ 4.5" x 4.5"
- C. 1 @ 3.5" x 3.5"



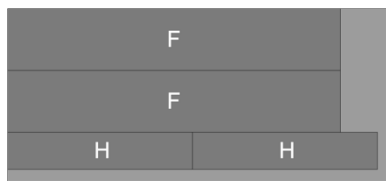
Fabric 2 (Your Bright) cut from 1 @ 9.5" x 8"

- B. 2 @ 4.5" x 4.5"
- E. 2 @ 3" x 3"



Fabric 3 (Dk) cut from 1 @ 8" x 6.5"

- D. 2 @ 3" x 3"
- I. 2 @ 7.5" x 1.5"



Fabric 4 (Med) cut from 1 @ 15.5" x 7"

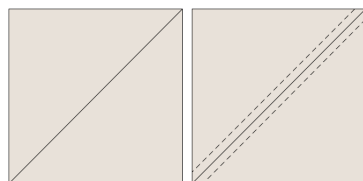
- F. 2 @ 13.5" x 2.5"
- H. 2 @ 7.5" x 1.5"



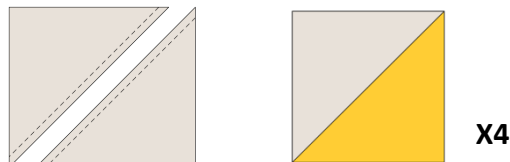
Fabric 5 (Light) cut from 1 @ 14" x 5.5"

- G. 2 @ 13.5" x 2.5"

1. With right sides together, and aligning edges, place an A and B square together. Draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on one wrong side. Sew a parallel line on either side and 0.25" away from the line.



2. Cut the unit along the diagonal drawn line. Press each seam towards the darker side. Trim each unit to 3.5" square, remembering to place the 45° line of the ruler along the seam. Make 4 of these half-square triangle units in total, using up the remaining A and B squares.



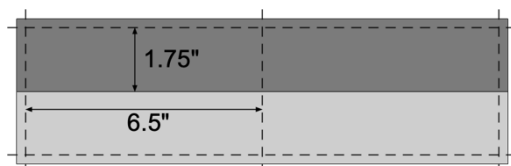
3. Using the D and E squares make 4 more half-square triangle units measuring 2" square.



4. Place G and F strips with right sides together, matching the corners. Sew an accurate 0.25" seam along one long edge.



5. Press the seam towards the darker side. Trim one end straight. Use that end to measure and cut 2 @ 6.5" wide units. Now, place the horizontal 1.75" line of your ruler on the seam, trim the top edge. Rotate the unit and repeat. This will make the unit 3.5" high.



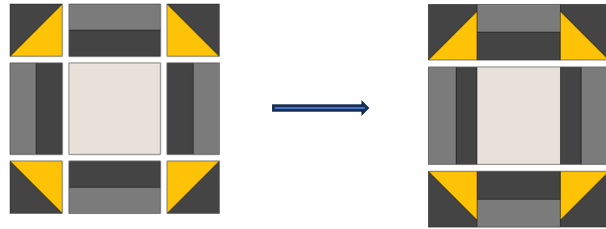
6. Make a total of 4 of these strips sets using up the remaining F and G strips. They should each measure 6.5" x 3.5".



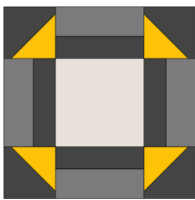
7. Make 4 more strip sets in the same way, using the H and I strips. To trim for height, place the 1" Horizontal ruler line on the seam, and trim the top edge. Rotate and repeat. Each unit should now measure 3.5" x 2".



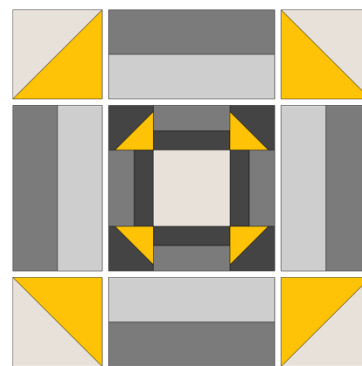
8. Layout the center square units – the half-square triangle units you made in 3, the strip sets you made in 7, and the C square. Sew the units in each row together, using a 0.25" seam. Press the seams in the top and bottom rows towards the strip sets, and in the middle row, away from the C square.



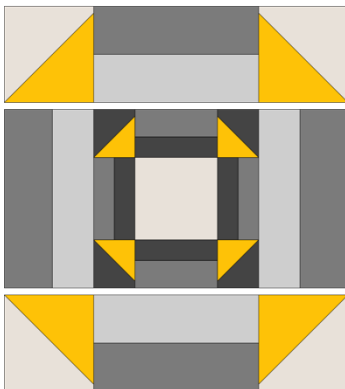
9. Finish the block center by sewing the rows together. Press the seams towards the middle. The unit should measure 6.5" square.



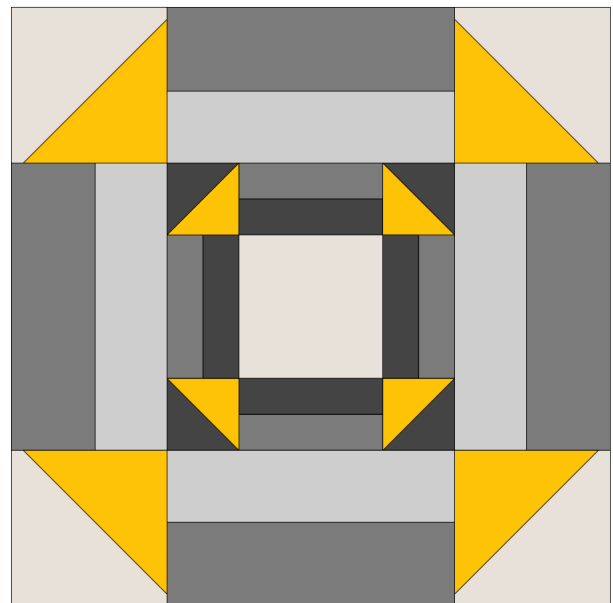
10. Now lay out all of your units as shown below.



11. Sew the units in each row together, using a 0.25" seam. Press the seams in the top and bottom rows towards the strip sets, and in the middle row, away from the middle.



12. Finish the block by sewing the rows together. Press the seams away from the middle. The block should measure 12.5" square. Please DO NOT square up your block before turning it in.
