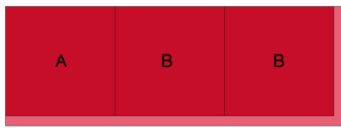
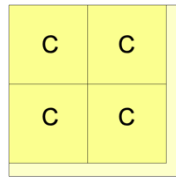


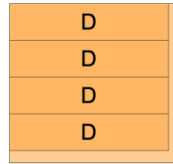

Please provide your own bright Fabric 1 – Bright Red



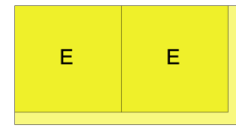
Fabric 1 (Your Red)
cut from 1 @ 17" x 6"
A. 1 @ 5.5" x 5.5"
B. 2 @ 5.5" x 5.5"



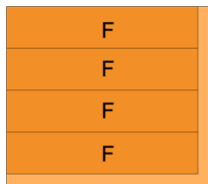
Yellow 1 (light)
cut from 1 @ 6.5" x 6.5"
C. 4 @ 3" x 3"



Orange 1 (light)
cut from 1 @ 7" x 6.5"
D. 4 @ 6.5" x 1.5"



Yellow 2 (mid)
cut from 9" x 4.75"
E. 2 @ 4.25" x 4.25"



Orange 2 (mid)
cut from 1 @ 8.5" x 7.5"
F. 4 @ 8" x 1.75"

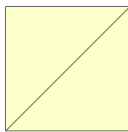


Yellow 3 (dark)
cut from 1 @ 9.5" x 5"
G. 2 @ 4.5" x 4.5"



Orange 3 (dark)
cut from 1 @ 13" x 7.5"
H. 4 @ 12.5" x 1.75"

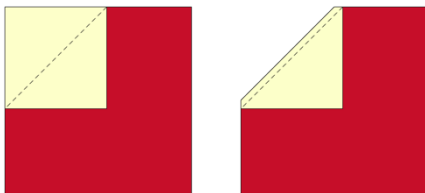
1. Mark the wrong side of each C square with a diagonal corner to corner line.



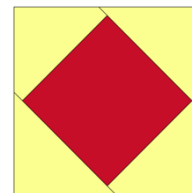
2. Making sure NOT to cut the A square, cut the B, E and G squares on the diagonal once. This will yield 4 triangles in each fabric.



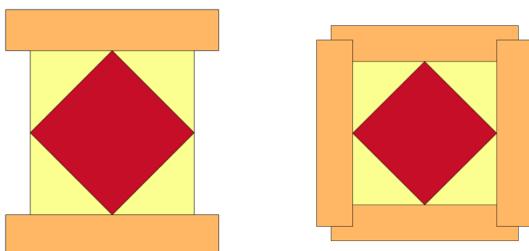
3. With right sides together, place a C square aligned with one corner of the A square. Sew a diagonal line from corner to corner across the C square. Trim 0.25" AWAY from the seam.



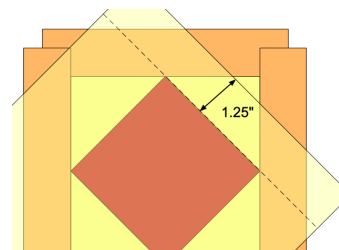
4. Press the seam towards the C corner. Repeat on the other three corners.



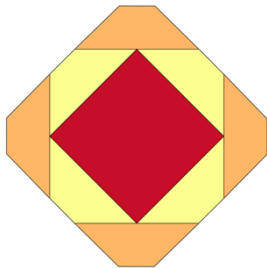
5. Sew a D strip to the top and bottom of the unit, being VERY careful to CENTER the strip on the unit edge. Press away from the center. Sew 2 more D strips to the left and right sides, pressing away from the center.



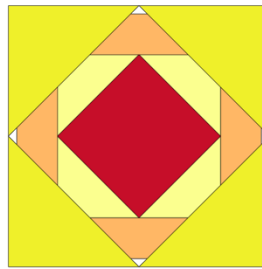
6. On each side, align the 1.25" line on your ruler with the seam along the red fabric, and trim away the excess.



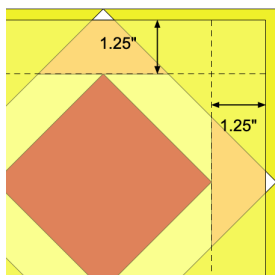
7. Your unit should look like the unit below.



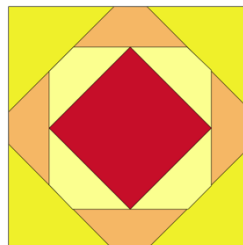
8. Center and align the LONG edge of an E triangle (careful of bias!) with a trimmed edge. Use a 0.25" seam to sew it in place. Press towards the corners. Repeat on the remaining 3 sides.



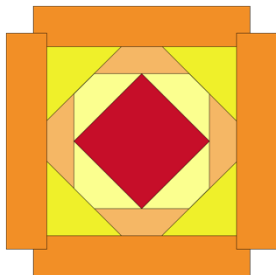
9. Trim the unit by placing the 1.25" line along the seam joining each D strip to the unit. Trim off the excess.



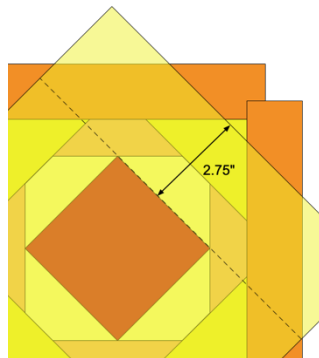
10. Your unit should measure 7.5" x 7.5".



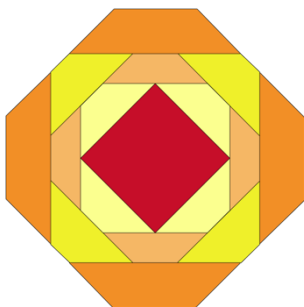
11. Sew an F strip to the top and bottom of the unit, being VERY careful to CENTER the strip on the unit edge. Press away from the center. Sew 2 more F strips to the left and right sides, pressing away from the center.



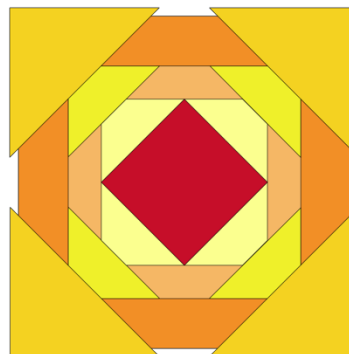
12. On each side, align the 2.75" line on your ruler with the seam along the red fabric, and trim away the excess.



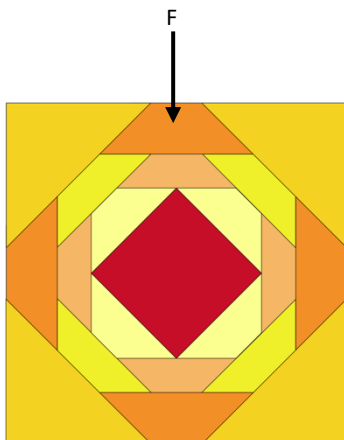
13. Your unit should look like the unit below.



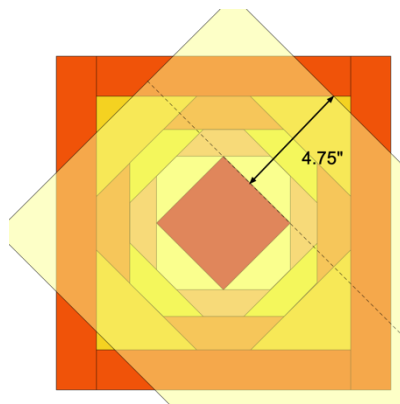
14. Center and align the LONG edge of a G triangle (careful of bias!) with a trimmed edge. Use a 0.25" seam to sew it in place. Press towards the corners. Repeat on the remaining 3 sides.



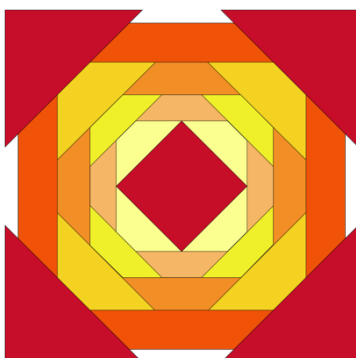
15. Trim the unit to the edges of the F strips. It should measure 10" x 10".



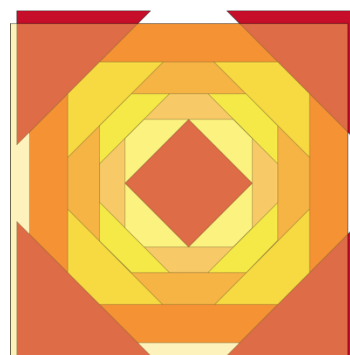
16. Sew an H strip to the top and bottom of the unit, being VERY careful to CENTER the strip on the unit edge. Press away from the center. Sew 2 more H strips to the left and right sides, pressing away from the center. Trim the unit by placing the 4.75" line along the edge of the red fabric, and trimming off the excess. Repeat on all 4 corners.



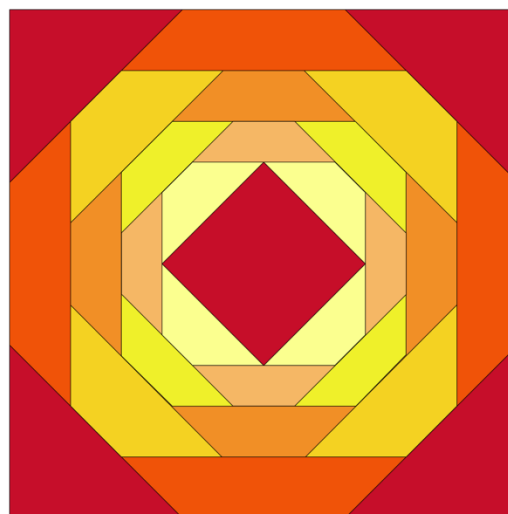
17. Center and align the LONG edge of a B triangle (careful of bias!) with a trimmed edge. Use a 0.25" seam to sew it in place, and remember to REINFORCE each seam at either end. Press towards the corners. Repeat on the remaining 3 sides.



18. Trim to the edges of the H strips. The block should measure 12.5" x 12.5".
