President's Message

Dear Guild,

I'd like to thank you all for your warm wishes as I accept the role of President. I'm fortunate to have been given this opportunity and I look forward to serving such a passionate group of quilters. To get things started with the proper foot forward, members of the Board and the Committee Chairs met this week to transition duties and prepare for the upcoming year. I asked them all to assist me with focusing our efforts this year on meeting a specific charge from the guild's By-laws.

"It shall be the purpose and goal of the Guild to promote and perpetuate the art of quilting. The work of the Guild is designed to educate all persons interested in preserving, continuing, and advancing this art. The Guild shall encourage a high standard of design and technique in all forms of quilting, and shall promote the art of quilting by teaching, sponsoring exhibits, and community outreach. [...]"--Article III of the CQG Bylaws

As a token of appreciation for their commitment to serve the guild, I gave each of them a sewing stiletto, as well as the following instructions for use:

Tailor's Awl or Stiletto; the tool you never knew you needed, but once you have it you won't know how you quilted without it! The Guild Leadership, that's me and my Sister Stiletto, are the perfect tool for our guild.

A stiletto is perfect for holding turned edges while ironing. The Sister Stiletto certainly do not want to scorch any fingers while we strive to keep our curves smooth and our raw edges turned under.

Stilettoes are for holding the fabric in line as it is going under the needle; keeps it from fish-tailing as you approach the end of the seam. They also help keep seams matched neatly as they go under the foot. The Sister Stiletto, will keep the guild gliding along straight while making beautiful quilts.

Unlike a seam ripper, stilettoes are used to help you sew as well as recover from the mistakes we all make. They are used to un-sew stitches, especially when the stitches are too fine for a seam ripper. The Sister Stiletto will help us to handle mistakes with a fine touch.

Quilters use a stiletto as an extension of their hand to guide fabric. My Sister Stiletto is an extension of my hand, and I will count on their support to guide the guild in the coming years.

And finally, in the words of Mary Tosch, a stiletto adds beauty to our quilting environment. It is my hope that our next year is filled with beautiful quilting.

I look forward to working with each and every one of our Leaders, and hope that our members will join us as we strive to *promote, perpetuate, preserve, and advance the art of quilting*.
